

Jackbox Battle Royale Rulebook

Version 1.0

Overview

Jackbox Battle Royale is a tournament-style competition where 4-6 streamers face off in multiple Jackbox Games to earn points and win the coveted title of Champion. Each match brings surprises, humor, and opportunities for audience engagement.

2. Tournament Structure

2.1 Format

- → The tournament consists of multiple rounds featuring various Jackbox Games.
- → A wheel spin determines the game for each round, adding randomness to the competition.
- → Contestants play through 4-6 games per tournament to accumulate points.

2.2 Scoring System

Points are awarded based on the final rankings in each game:

→ 1st Place: 4-6 points
→ 2nd Place: 3-5 points
→ 3rd Place: 2-4 points

→ 4th Place or Below: 1-3 points

(Exact point distribution depends on the number of players.)

2.3 Tiebreakers

→ In the event of a tie, a special "sudden-death" mini-game or trivia question will determine the winner.

3. Contestant Rules

3.1 Eligibility

- → Contestants must be streamers or content creators invited by The Couch Crew.
- → Contestants must have access to Discord for communication and coordination.

3.2 Conduct

- → Respect other contestants, the host, and the audience.
- → No offensive or inappropriate humor, even in games that encourage creativity.
- → Avoid cheating or collusion to manipulate game outcomes.

3.3 Participation Requirements

- → Contestants must be available for the entire event duration (approximately 2-3 hours).
- → Ensure a stable internet connection to avoid disruptions.

3.4 Replays/Substitutes

→ If a player disconnects mid-game, the host will decide whether to replay the game or substitute the contestant for the next round.

4. Game Rules

4.1 General Gameplay

- → Follow the instructions provided by the Jackbox game.
- → Use creativity and strategy to maximize your score, depending on the game mechanics.

4.2 Game-Specific Rules

- → Each game has its own rules, which will be explained before starting.
- → Some games may have custom adjustments or challenges set by the host.

4.3 Audience Influence

- → Audience members can vote or influence outcomes in certain games.
- → Contestants are not allowed to solicit votes from their communities during gameplay.

4.4. Team Games

- → For games requiring teams (e.g., The Poll Mine, Push the Button), points are doubled:
- → Winning team: 12 points (divided evenly among members)
- → Losing team: 6 points (divided evenly among members)

4.5 Fair Play

- → No spamming or trolling in-game answers or audience inputs.
- → Avoid exploiting game mechanics unfairly.

5. Host and Moderator Roles

5.1 Host Responsibilities

- → Spin the wheel to select games randomly.
- → Announce scores and provide commentary.
- → Enforce rules and resolve disputes.

5.2 Moderators

- → Moderators will monitor chat and gameplay for rule violations.
- → They may issue warnings or penalties as needed.

6. Audience Participation

6.1 Joining as Audience

- → Viewers can join as audience members via the Jackbox game code displayed on-screen.
- → Audience members can influence gameplay by voting or contributing to decisions.

6.2 Rules for Audience

- → Keep audience interactions fun and light-hearted.
- → Do not spam inappropriate content during audience participation rounds.
- → Follow The Couch Crew's Twitch Chat Rules while interacting.

7. Penalties and Violations

7.1 Warnings

→ Minor infractions (e.g., excessive trolling) result in a verbal warning.

7.2 Point Deductions

→ Repeated minor infractions or disruptive behavior may lead to a 1-2 point deduction.

7.3 Disqualification

→ Major violations, such as harassment or cheating, will result in immediate disqualification.

8. Recognition

8.1 Champion Title

→ The contestant with the **highest score** at the end of the tournament is crowned the **Jackbox Battle Royale Champion**.

8.2 Highlight Reel

→ Tournament highlights will be featured on The Couch Crew's social media and Twitch channel.

9. Technical and Troubleshooting

9.1 Technical Requirements

→ Contestants must stream from a PC, console, or device capable of running Discord and Jackbox Games.

9.2 Connectivity Issues

→ If a game is interrupted due to technical issues, the host will decide whether to replay or skip the round.

9.3 Game Code Distribution

→ Contestants and audience members will receive the game code via the Twitch stream.
Do not share codes externally.

10. Feedback and Suggestions

→ Players and audience members are encouraged to share feedback to improve future tournaments. To submit suggestions, use The Couch Crew's Discord or feedback form.
